## "Stairs, 4 Ways to Beat Them and Remain in Your Home"

Each and every day, we get invited to the homes of our clients, and we see what is preventing you from staying comfortably in your home. Here in Colorado, we challenge you to find a house that doesn't have a step or a long staircase as a barrier to get into the home and to move about the house.

Residential Stairs are the main barrier in our homes here in Colorado. From the 3-4 steps to get in the front door or the garage, to the full flight of stairs to the basement or 2nd floor, our steps lead to where we want to live. How many homes have the main bedrooms and the main bathrooms upstairs? There are 4 main types of stair configurations that create obstacles in our living space.

Here are the available solutions along with some pictures and videos to show you how they work for the home.

### SHORT STAIRCASES

Either to get in the front door or the garage door or between floors, the short staircases can be dangerous places. Adding a second wood railing or steel railing can add safety and allow the user to have a solid handhold on the stairs.





### STRAIGHT STAIRCASES

Straight stairs are the most simple barrier to remove with the installation of a straight stairlift. Typically from 4-14 steps, a stairlift





consists of a rail that is installed on the steps and a chair that rides the rail up and down. This is a simple solution because the lift installs to the steps themselves and doesn't touch the walls. In this way, they can be mounted to either side of the stairs, and don't leave any permanent marks or changes to the stairs.



Straight Stairlift

Many of our clients try to climb the stairs only once or twice a day, but with the addition of a straight stairlift they can go up

anytime they would like. For safety, the chair swivels at the top and provides a safe place to exit the lift. The height of the chair can be adjusted taller to make it easier to stand or lower to allow for wheelchair transfers. This option can eliminate falls and make living in the home easier. Included are two remote controls that allow 2 people to use the lift.

### STAIRS WITH A LANDING OR A CURVE

Some of the most beautiful obstacles are a curved staircase or a split staircase with a landing in the middle. Many bi-level or townhomes have these type of stairs. The most common solution is 2 straight stairlifts or a custom curved stairlift. With a landing in the middle, you can use a lift to reach the landing and then change chairs to a second lift for the ride to the top. This is not ideal if you have any difficulty in your transfers or there are steps on the landing.

The better option is a curved stairlift that is custom made to fit your stairs. This offers an elevator like ride from top to bottom with a push of a button. The chair swivels just like the straight lift, and you can do up to 5 levels in a home with this type of lift.

## WHEELCHAIR LIFTS, VERTICAL LIFTS AND ELEVATORS



Elevator

The final solutions to beat stairs are a wheelchair lift or an elevator. Because a stairlift doesn't carry a wheelchair and requires the rider to transfer from chair to chair, a wheelchair lift or elevator is a great option for use with a wheelchair. The user can ride into the lift along with another rider and travel either directly up to following the line of the stairs.
